How to Measure Your Kitchen

Having the correct measurements is the cornerstone for any kitchen and bathroom project. Here is a guide that'll help you with your space design and accurate measuring

- 1. The only tools you need are a tape measure, graph paper and a pencil.
- 2. Start measuring the overall length of each wall, starting on the left and working clockwise around the room.
- 3. Measure each wall horizontally at 36-inch height. Take vertical measurements from the floor to windowsill, from windowsill to top of windows, from top of windows to ceiling, and then from floor to ceiling.
- 4. Mark the centerline of all appliances and other features location (range, sinks, ovens, doors, windows, hood vent, soffits, outlets, etcetera).
- 5. Doors and windows need to be measured considering the casting and/or molding around them. Measure from the outside part of it.
